

Farm

We were able to spread about 100 of the total 130 tons of lime that were delivered. This included all areas that were in need of liming and are scheduled to be used for research this coming growing season. The rest of the areas scheduled for liming were just too wet and the spreader trucks were not able to work in those fields. These wet fields also included many areas that were planted in wheat for GSDC. We plan to take care of spreading these areas later this year, possibly after wheat harvest.

We were able to have chicken litter applied this week to some of the lower fertility areas on the farm. Jason was able to coordinate the work with our neighbor, Dan Dawson, who did the actual delivering and spreading of the litter from his chicken houses.

Research

The PSF has been receiving adequate rainfall the last few weeks to take care of soil moisture requirements for all of the many different forage plot areas. There has also been enough rainfall to start the process of refilling all of the storage ponds on the farm. We are thankful for the rain.

Comments

Penn-Pak in Madison has agreed to buy the milo crop we have stored in the grain bins. They agreed to pay \$4.50 a bushel for about 2500 bushels of milo that we will deliver to their buying point in Madison. Ryan was able to deliver one load Friday morning. We were not able to deliver another load that day because of a elevator breakdown Friday afternoon at the Penn-Pak buying point.
